From the Pastor...

Our original Hope Church land purchase amounted to about eleven acres with our 6,000-square-foot, three-story building at the top of the drive on the northern end of the property. With the wonderful professional help of members Ed Day and Rudy Jasperson and a cadre of Hope members, the downstairs and second levels of the building were finished off and made ready for worship, office and classroom space.

Worship furniture (altar, etc) and liturgical fixtures (candle sticks, cross, book stand, offering plates, hymnals, etc) were given by Lutheran churches in the area. Chairs (which we still use in our fellowship hall) were purchased from a company in Rome, Georgia.

We had a small kitchen down at the back of the first floor — by the offices and the bathrooms. And we had tables on the second floor for classroom and fellowship purposes. Not long after I got to the church, the Lutheran Church of the Redeemer in Atlanta (my former parish), gave us a bunch of room dividers and furniture that we used up on the third floor to make more formal classroom space.

The only complaint I ever heard concerning our worship space was that there were no windows to let the sunlight in. We probably could worship about 50 or 60 people comfortably in that space. It served us wonderfully well.

Over the next two years the congregation grew steadily. More and more people signed our charter document. Our goal was to reach about 120 members by my two-year mark at the church so we could take the next step to officially organize as a congregation of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). My call-letter from the synod as a development pastor was for two years, terminating at the end of September, 2001. As we planned to have our bishop with us so we could officially become an organized congregation by the end of that time, I got a call from Bishop Warren telling me we'd have to push our celebration back a month to the end of October because of a conflict in his schedule.

That meant I'd not be under call for a month as my call letter extended only – as I said – to the end of September... SO - I have in my files a one-month interim call letter from the synod that took me to the beginning of November.

Sadly, there was a lot of confusion in the relationship we shared with our mission director before that transition from mission church to officially organized congregation. We just couldn't get answers from him about what continuing funding for our ministry would be like moving forward. Understand that congregations weren't expected to be self-supporting getting started.

So Steering Committee (what we used to call our church council) Chairman Rudy Jasperson and I flew up to Chicago (ELCA home office) to square things away with the Director of Mission Development Dick Magnus and our mission director. Thankfully, we got things ironed out, were apologized to for any misunderstandings, and were able to move forward without any further hitches.

Back at the church we got ready for the big day. It was Reformation Sunday. We had our usual 10:45 service, took in new members (including Jim Berman who is still with us today), and got ready for a service with the bishop later that afternoon.

The bishop — who'd been in Alabama earlier that day - arrived about an hour-and-a-half before the service started. Our Mission Director - who'd been in South Atlanta — didn't arrive until communion time in the service. I think Bishop Warren was not pleased.

Otherwise? It was a glorious day in the life of Hope Lutheran Church! We shared a fabulous meal and we had visitors from several other Atlanta churches. Pastor James Lehmann and a wonderful contingent of folks came down from Immanuel Lutheran Church in Flatville, Illinois, to share this day with us. These were the faithful folks who'd been supporting Hope financially for the previous three years!

We were off and running! Next month I'll tell you about long-range planning, adding a second worship service, buying some more land, expanding our sanctuary, growing our ministries and more.


